

September 17, 2019, ACCC Business Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order by President Al McCloud at 7:31PM. There were 16 attendees.

New members Ron and Elizabeth Mahafey were present. They have a 2014 Stingray, a 2003 coupe, and an '85 coupe. They are also members of BCC.

John Horvath motioned to accept the August minutes; it was seconded by Dave Jones. The motion passed unanimously.

NCM Ambassador. Bud Donner provided some 2019 Corvette production statistics: there were 34,822 Corvettes produced; 77% were automatics, 84% were coupes; the #1 color was white, #2 was black, #3 was Torch Red; least popular colors were yellow and Admiral Blue. The NCM has 38,000 members, 750 clubs, and 225,000 annual visitors.

Bud also mentioned the annual Hickory Bridge Farm cruise and referred members to this newsletter for more information.

Vice President. Joan Yaros thanked Skip and Marie Sizemore for coordinating the Graves Mountain Lodge cruise. John Horvath and John Amabile attended the NCRS car show at Sully. 

Farewell C7

This month I want to talk about the C7 Corvette because I think it is the best styled and engineered Corvette to date. However, the Corvette is the halo car for Chevrolet (maybe all of GM), meaning it must have the styling and engineering to attract attention and get customers into showrooms. Now not all those people coming to the showrooms will buy a Corvette, but there are other Chevrolets in those showrooms that may capture some of those customers. That is good for GM and people that like Corvettes.

The production run for the C7 has been relatively short (2014-2019) but the C7 Corvette represents the ultimate in the front-engine mass-produced automobiles. You might be able to come up with another front-engine car that has marginally better performance, but it would be a hand-built custom car that very few could afford and would cost a fortune to buy and maintain. With the C7 Corvette you can buy it and have it maintained at the corner Chevrolet dealership at a reasonable price and have the style and performance few cars in the world can match at those prices. This has always been the beauty of the Corvette.

The C7 has shown that Chevrolet has developed the front engine rear drive layout about as far as it can go. In order to keep the Corvette relevant in the high style, high performance world, the C8 mid-engined car had to be built.

The C7 version of the Corvette was so well done that it will be a prized possession of owners for years to come. No matter what version of the C7 you choose, be it the base model, the Grand Sport, Z06, or the mighty ZR1, they are all beautiful performance icons. Long live the C7 and welcome aboard C8.

This information is for those who are going to Ocean City, October 3-7, for 2019 Corvette Weekend hosted by Free State Corvette Club. We have six "newbies" this year so I thought this would be helpful. Travel to Ocean City on Thursday or Friday, depending on your reservation, will be on your own. Please be aware that the deck rehabilitation on the Chesapeake Bay Bridge spans starts on October 1 and could cause some delays. Repairs will continue until next May.

Check in at Paradise Plaza on 9th Street at the Boardwalk is at 4:00 pm. If your room is ready, maybe earlier. We are on the 4th floor oceanfront. If you received a confirmation email from Paradise, take a few minutes to claim free voucher rewards given to you upon check in. You may be able to use some of them with our plans.





Every Child Deserves a Little Christmas




Annually, the U. S. Marine Corps Reserve **Toys for Tots** Program collects toys and distributes them to less fortunate children in the community. The primary goal of **Toys for Tots** is to deliver, through a new toy at Christmas, a message of hope to less fortunate youngsters that will assist them in becoming responsible, productive, patriotic citizens.

Did you know? **Toys for Tots** began as a Los Angeles charitable effort in 1947. Major Bill Hendricks, USMCR, was inspired by his wife Diane when she tried to donate a home-made Raggedy Ann doll to a needy child but couldn't find any organization to do so. At her suggestion, he gathered a group of local Marine reservists who collected some 5,000 toys for local children that year from collection bins placed outside Warner Brothers movie theaters.

In 2018, the **Toys for Tots** program conducted nearly 800 local campaigns covering all 50 states, DC, and U.S. Territories. With generous help from the American public, the Marines and volunteers distributed **18 million toys to 7 million** less fortunate children! This is our third annual year supporting this program!! Please bring a new, unwrapped toy or two at 11:00am on Saturday, December 7, to the Hilldrup Moving and Storage Facility near the back gate of Quantico MCB, 4022 Jefferson Davis Hwy, Stafford, VA 22554. 

EDITOR'S NOSTALGIA - 1981 Corvette

As the year began, Corvettes were slated to be built in both St. Louis and a new facility in Bowling Green, Kentucky. The first Kentucky-built unit rolled off the line in June while St. Louis manufacturing was phased out in August.

Conversion of the painting process was being overhauled. St. Louis-built units were mostly solid colors using traditional lacquers. Bowling Green, on the other hand, built two-tone units using a new enamel-type paint with clearcoat finishes.



There were no engine options offered in 1981 since the 350ci block was certified for sale in California and was available throughout the United States with both four-speed manual and automatic transmissions.

Chevrolet's "computer command control," used on California-sold units, became standard equipment on all models. The system automatically adjusted engine timing and air-fuel mixture.

Weight reduction remained a key design factor. For Corvettes with automatic transmissions and standard suspensions, a fiberglass-reinforced, mono-leaf rear spring was introduced. Weighing only eight pounds, it replaced a 44-pound steel spring assembly. And, all 1981 valve covers were magnesium for even greater weight savings.

A six-way, power adjustable seat on the driver's side became available for the first time, but not for the passenger, and the anti-theft alarm system was improved through the addition of an ignition interrupt to prevent engine start-up.
