NEWS FROM THE NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM (NCM) April 2023 Dave Jones

The National Corvette Museum is busy this time of year. In addition to the normal displays and artifacts, events planned at the Museum for April and May include the annual Michelin Bash in April and honoring our military veterans in May.

The "2023 Michelin NCM Bash" is scheduled for Thursday, April 27 through Saturday, April 29. The event includes seminars by Michelin, Mobil 1, General Motors Assembly Plant and classroom sessions by GM certified Corvette Technician Paul Koerne. Also available are guided road tours, a car show, live auction and vendors. On-line registration closes at 9 AM central time on Friday, April 7. All registrants will receive a hard-card credential, lanyard, event pin and dash plaque. Registration rates are Lifetime \$35pp, Member \$40pp and Non-Member \$50pp. Guided road tours offered during the event include: James Beam Tour & Lunch in Clermont, KY; Blue Grass Music Hall of Fame / Fetta Specialty Pizza Lunch in Owensboro, KY; and Andrew Jackson's Hermitage & FKS Kitchen in Hermitage, TN. There is a per person fee for each tour. The event also includes a High Performance Driving Event (HPDE) to improve your driving skills. Seminars and classroom events include "Behind the Scenes: E-Ray on Ice @ Rockefeller Center NYC", "A Fast History of Corvette & Michelin Racing", "Mobil 1 Tech Talk", and much more. Check the museum website for more detailed information on the event events and fees at corvettemuseum.org.

In May the Museum will be celebrating our military veterans from Thursday, May 11 through Saturday, May 13 with the "Vets 'n Vettes" weekend. Originally held in November the event has been moved to coincide with Military Appreciation Month. On-line registration closes at 9 AM central time on Monday, April 24. Lifetime Registration is \$35pp, Members registration is \$40pp and Non-Member registration is \$50pp. All events are open to Event Registrants only. On-line registrants will receive a hardcard credential, lanyard and event pin. Thursday will include a half-day at the NCM Motorsports Park, including touring laps in your vehicle. This is not a high-speed track event and passengers are allowed. A lunch in the Motorsports Park Garage is included. There will be a banquet Thursday evening and the guest speaker is Bob Lutz, Automotive Hall of Fame Member. Guided road tours offered during the event include: Lux Row Distillers & Lunch at BJs Steakhouse in Bardstown, KY; Andrew Jackson's Hermitage & FKS Kitchen in Hermitage, TN; and American Legion Veteran's Luncheon. 

What Did You Do to Your Corvette?!!

Pete Rutledge — 1954 Corvette

On one cold day this past winter, I went to open the hood on my '54 Corvette. The release handle was hard to pull and the hood did not release. That was worrisome because while the hood can be opened if the hood release doesn't work, it involves jacking up the car, getting under it, and with great difficulty, releasing the hood latches, first one and then the other, with a long pry bar or similar long tool. I wasn't looking forward to doing that, so I elected to do nothing for the time being. Time passed and one day when the temperature was a little warmer I tried again to open this hood. This time, while it was still a hard pull, the hood popped open. Needless to say, for the next couple of months, I did not latch the hood for fear of it getting stuck shut again. This past month, I decided to do something about the hood opening problem. I suspected that the hood release cable assembly might have corrosion or lubrication problems. So I removed the cable assembly to inspect/fix it. When off the car, the cable functioned just fine, with no sign of corrosion or lack of lubrication. What could be the problem? I played around with the cable and found that if the cable was bent too sharply, effort needed to pull the hood release increased significantly. So I decided I would reinstall the cable and make sure that from the hood release knob to the hood latches, the cable would not make any sharp bends as it wound its way under the dashboard. After finding the best path for the cable, I was gratified to find that the hood release knob required no unusual effort and the hood popped up just like it did when it was new, 69 years ago.
