--Picnic Update. Signups and payments continue.

--The August ACCC breakfast will be held on the 13th at the Juke Box Diner in Manassas at 10:00am, followed by the Old Dominion Corvette Club car show at Bomnin Chevrolet. POC is Ron Mahaffey.

--Christmas Party (December 17, Alpine Chef, 1:00pm-4:00pm). The cost for members is \$35.00. Non-members/guests will pay the regular price of \$48.52. Any alcohol/wine purchases will be paid for separately by the member or guest. Christmas party checks made payable to the ACCC must be received by Marie Sizemore no later than November 1, 2023.

New Business:

Charity Donations

--The President led a discussion for member approval on how to distribute the \$500.00 (in two separate payments of \$250.00 each) that the board agreed to share with local charities.

--The board suggested that \$250.00 should be donated to The Brisben Center, a 501c3 organization and recurring recipient of ACCC support.

--It was suggested that the second payment be made to Stafford Emergency Relief Through Volunteer Efforts (SERVE) a 501c3 organization. Members in attendance voted to approve both suggestions.

The new by-law changes will be distributed to the general membership and a vote will be taken at the next meeting of the members in attendance.

NEWS FROM THE NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM (NCM) August 2023 Dave Jones (Email: oneregal@yahoo.com)

"The Performance Gallery" is one space in the NCM that has been around since the museum opening over 25 years ago. In the early days, the gallery had an elevated "racetrack" to give cars a feeling of motion and of being on the grid, but there were significant problems with changing out the vehicles and it was later removed. The space housed an interactive pit crew challenge, educational driving simulator, and various artifacts. Thanks to the generosity of E. Pierce Marshall, the gallery has received a major facelift. With the Marshall donation, the gallery has received long over-due renovations. The Gallery now features digital projection, interactive touch screens paired with artifact display cases, 180-degree video footage, and an impressive line up of cars. Highlighted front and center in the exhibit is Pierce's C7.R. The intent was to have something more interactive that would engage younger people to help ensure future generations will be able to learn how unique the Corvette is in America's car culture and racing history. The Gallery opened on June 8 and has been renamed the "E. Pierce Marshall Memorial Performance Gallery."

Don't forget that the NCM website has interesting and educational videos that are available at corvettemuseum.org. After accessing the website, at the top of the page go to the "Education & Collections" dropdown. There you will find the "Vettecademy," which is geared toward school-age kids, with home educational and entertaining episodes on numerous aspects of the Corvette. Also available is "Fully Vetted," which is geared towards extreme Corvette enthusiasts. Currently there are eleven episodes, such as Episode 1 - Harley Earl and the Inspiration for Corvette and Episode 3 - Zora Duntov and Corvette's Competition. Check them out.

On a sad note, Ely Reeves Callaway III, 75, passed away on July 11 at his home in New-

port Beach, California, after sustaining injuries in a fall. He was a self-taught pioneer who pushed the boundaries of automotive design. Reeves started Callaway Cars, in 1977. His mission was not to enhance Corvette performance but simply to put food on the table for his family the only way he knew how . . . build something beautiful and powerful that would appeal to the owners of fine automotive machinery. In 1986 his company became allied with (Continued on next page)

the iconic American car, the Corvette. In 1988, in a modified Corvette, he reached over 254 miles per hour, breaking a world-record. His engineering achievements in the Corvette performance arena began with the factory RPO B2K Twin Turbo Corvettes (1987-1991). Other achievements continued with the world-record holding 254 mph "Sledgehammer," C4 Aerobody package, LT-1 and LT-5 SuperNatural Corvettes, C12 Callaway Supercars, C5/C6 power group packages, and the current C6 Supercharged Corvettes/C16 Supercars. Of incidental information is his father, Ely Reeves Jr., a textile executive who, in the 1980s, founded Callaway Golf Company





Meet Rules

- All show vehicles will be classified by Bull Run Region upon arrival, and decisions are final.
- Stock vehicles, Class A, must be 25 years or older and reflect equipment available for the year and model vehicle except for minor upgrades and safety modifications.
- Modified vehicles, Class B, must be 25 years old or older based on the vehicle's state registration.
- Post-1998 vehicles, whether stock or modified, are in Class C.
- Vehicles may be displayed as the owner wishes within the space allotted and must not interfere with other participants or traffic flow. Hoods must be open for best-of-show judging.
- All vehicles should have a charged fire extinguisher available.
- Vehicles must be driven onto the show field under their own power.
- Once parked, vehicles must remain turned off until the meet is over at approximately 3:00 pm.
- Vehicles needing to exit earlier must be escorted off the field. Contact a Bull Run member to arrange escort.
- Cars with "For Sale" and/or "Raffle" signs must be in the Car Corral and registered for the show as such.
- No alcoholic beverages are permitted.
- No food sales unless authorized in advance by Bull Run Region.
- Pre-registration fees are non-refundable except for show cancellation by Bull Run Region.
- Late arrivals (after 11 am) may not be eligible for judging.

What Did You Do to Your Corvette?!!

Skip Sizemore — 2016 Coupe

On a return trip from Daytona, our 2016 Corvette started making a rattling noise. Being half deaf, I was not hearing the noise, but Marie could and kept asking, what was making the noise. After a couple of weeks the noise had gotten bad enough that I could hear it. The noise sounded like rattling sheet metal and was not a constant sound. It occurred a light/ partial throttle and would disappear at at



higher RPMs (engine speed). The noise finally got annoying enough that I jacked the Corvette up and got under to see what was going on. After a few minutes of looking, pushing and pulling, I could not find anything that might be causing the problem. After more examination I noticed a tiny oil leak at the front of the engine. The leak was coming from the accessory belt tensioner (see picture below).



Most of these devices use a spring to maintain tension, but Chevrolet decided to use a tiny shock absorber in this application. They may want to reconsider, since this one started leaking at only thirty two thousand miles.

Replacement of the tensioner is not a big job and can probably be done in about an hour and a half. The belt must be removed during this job. This is a good time to check the belt and replace it if needed. However, I did not do the job. I had it done at the local Chevrolet dealer and used the extended warranty I bought.

When we bought our C7 Corvette, I knew it had by a lot more electronics and other expensive components that our C5 did not. This made me concerned, so I bought an extended warranty from the Ally company (one hundred dollar deductible). I had never bought an extra warranty before, but the complexity and cost of repairs for a C7 made me take the plunge. It was expensive, but I tend to keep my cars for a long time, so hopefully it will pay for itself. At this point, I have had to use it on three occasions. I used it for the belt tensioner replacement, replacement of a defective gas filler door cable and a vacuum leak repair.

I hope this is helpful to all you fellow C7 owners.


