NEWS FROM THE NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM (NCM) November 2023 Dave Jones (Email: oneregal@yahoo.com)

The NCM Motorsports Park offers many opportunities for the driver to experience road course events. Below is a summary of events that are available for a fee at the Park's 3.2 mile, 23-turn racetrack:

--The Corvette Experience - This is a streamlined experimental driving school that lets you loose on the 3.2 mile racetrack in a C8 Corvette. Alternating track sessions totaling an hour behind the wheel and an hour learning the ropes from track certified instructors. The experience includes a lunch voucher to Stringray Grill and admission to the NCM. For and additional fee you can bring a guest to the classroom portion as well as lunch and NCM admission. And for another fee the guest can ride in the passenger seat with a professional driver in a 20-minute session ride along.

--C8 Touring Laps - Enjoy the performance of America's sports car on the Park's 3.2 mile racetrack. Drive a C8 Corvette on the track in a lead/follow format for 4 laps.

--C7 Corvette Touring Laps - Test the performance of the C7 Corvette on the Park's racetrack. Drive the C7 on the track in a lead/follow format for 4 laps.

--Camaro Touring Laps -Try out the new Camaro SS with the 1LE Track Performance Package! This 455hp 6.2L V8, with 10-speed transmission and performance package exhaust really turns heads. The Camaro has Magnetic Ride Control and Performance Traction Management Systems that will enhance your enjoyment of the experience.

--Corvette Bundle – The ultimate experience for Corvette enthusiasts, this package demonstrates the capabilities of both the C7 and C8 Corvettes. Get behind the wheel of both cars for four laps each on the 3.2-mile track in a lead/follow format. Note that the C7s have a 7-speed manual transmission.

--Camaro & Corvette Package - Enjoy the performance capabilities of all three GM sports cars, the C7 and C8 Corvettes and the Camaro SS 1LE. Enjoy four laps behind the wheel of all three cars on the 3.2 mile racetrack for a total of twelve laps.

Participation requirements are:

--Must be 18 years of old and have a valid drivers' license.

--Must sign a Vehicle Damage Policy and Indemnity Agreement.

--Helmets provided. Must wear closed toe shoes and long pants.

--Cancellations made 7 days or more in advance of the event date, will receive a 100% refund. Event will run rain or shine. No refunds will be made after completion of services.

What Did You Do to Your Corvette?

Dave Jones — 2006 Coupe

Dave just acquired a 2006 coupe (see picture on the cover of this issue). The engine is 364ci/400hp (6.0L) with a 6-speed manual transmission. The exterior is Monterrey Red and it has a Cashmere interior. Mileage is 44K. It has an AM/FM/CD with navigation. Dual roof panels. And for sport, it has the Z51 performance package. Dave is selling his 2006 Collector Edition (see the for sale ad in this issue).

Pete Rutledge — 1954 Corvette

Well this month I needed a new battery for the '54, so I thought I would try a new fangled Optima 6 volt battery covered by a "Tar Topper Opt 6" (a plastic box intended to look like a vintage 6 volt battery), but both were too large to fit the battery tray, so I ended up with an Interstate 6 volt, which is somewhat vintage looking with 3 white battery caps. I also continued my work to fit the Plasticon hardtop on the car. I found that two metal covers over the soft top hinges had been missing from my car for who knows how many years; I found a pair on eBay and installed them. I now have all the latches and weatherstripping needed to finish the installation of the hardtop, except for paint and headliner. I may just re-prime the exterior for now, as I am planning to repaint the '54 in its original Pennant Blue, in which case the hard top will be painted that same color.

My Adventure at Ron Fellows

Day one began early for a drive from downtown Vegas to the Ron Fellows Performance Driving School at Spring Mountain Motor Resort and Country Club in Pahrump, Nevada.

A delicious buffet breakfast in the clubhouse was first on the agenda; then on to the classroom at 8:00 AM.

Introduction of the instructors (JJ, Justin, Vinny, Rico, Tammy, Teddy, and Star); then an explanation of how the day would progress. We were divided into three groups for the first exercises, first the serpentine where we learned about turn-in and apexes. Three times thru this course, one time with the windshield completely covered so we had to use driver and passenger windows exclusively to negotiate the cones; braking exercise where we learned to fully utilize the capability of the C8s anti lock brake system; here we learned to max brake (pedal to the floor) and steer the car to avoid an object on a wet track; and then our first venture onto the road course where we did a practical application of what we leaned on the serpentine, turn in and find/hit the apex.

Following a hearty lunch in the clubhouse, back to the classroom for more instruction and new exercises. Autocross practice, more road course time and additional classroom time.

Autocross practice took us thru the course behind the instructor to show the route thru the cones to the finish in a "box" designated by orange cones where we had to come to a complete stop in the box or face a 5 second penalty and 1 second penalty for each cone displaced along the course.

At the end of the day, I checked into the provided condo for the evening. The first night that I stayed in Vegas, I could have elected to stay at the lodge for an additional fee.

Day 2 began with buffet breakfast and then classroom at 8:00 AM.

Summarizing day 2 was more classroom time to learn about the electronics and other features of the car, then time on the wet skid pad where we did figure 8s with no traction control sliding and drifting the cars, sometimes doing unintentional 180s and maybe 270s with an instructor in the car with us who then engaged the weather mode to show us the car would not spin or skid in that mode. Comforting!!

On to the Autocross competition where we each got 3 attempts against the clock for bragging rights within our group.

2 more sessions on the road course, 3 laps each following the instructor around the course to perfect our technique of turn-in and apex along with proper braking prior to the turn-in. We were hitting triple digits on the road course so insurance required the students to be in helmets and HANS devices. I should mention that during the lead/follow sessions the instructor was talking to us from their car on CB radios. Let me count the times I heard "Jack you missed that apex again"!

My Adventure at Ron Fellows (cont'd)

The day was finalized with the top 3 Autocross times in each group being recognized, then presentation of the completion certificates.

I have to say that the money was a great investment, as I learned much about the car and its capabilities, making me much more confident.

Spouses are welcome at the owner's school. For only \$40 more, your spouse or significant other can attend and stay with you in the lodge and their meals are included along with hot laps with the instructors on the road course and transportation to viewing areas for photo opportunities. Clara elected to not attend the course this time.

I encourage anyone who wants to learn about their C8, or is thinking about buying a C8, or just wants to experience this, go! I don't think you will regret it.




