I acquired a 1996 Chevrolet Corvette LT4 350/330HP with a 6 Speed Transmission, Arctic White with Black Interior, 2 Owner Car with on 57K Miles (Very Well Taken Care Of and It's Extremely Nice) Loaded Up With Options, LT4's are getting really hard to find!!



Pete Rutledge — 1954 Corvette

This month I repaired my driver side outside mirror mounting. It had be previously, and incorrectly, attached to the door with wood screws into the fiberglass. The mirror had loosened up over time, and eventually ripped out of the door taking a little fiberglass with it. I patched the holes in the door with fiberglass mat and resin, sanded it flat, re-drilled the proper size holes in the patched areas, and remounted the mirror (after cleaning/polishing) with machine screws, fender washers, external teeth lock washers, and hex nuts. It is now solidly mounted and all the repairs are hidden under the mirror base (see below).
