NEWS FROM THE NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM (NCM) February 2024

Last month I provided a quick look at future NCM exhibits and events for 2024. This month I offer more information on the events coming in March and April as follows:

- -Beginning on March 15 and running throughout 2024 is: LUSTER: Realism and Hyperrealism in Contemporary Automobile and Motorcycle Painting. This traveling museum is an art exhibit of over 55 present day realists and hyperrealists who specialize in automobiles and motorcycles as their primary subject matter. Throughout the 20th and 21st centuries, cars and motorcycles have not only been prominent on the nation's streets and highways, but also in film, music's top hits and in painting. With the emergence of photo-realism in the 1960's, motorized vehicles have assumed a special place of distinction as subject mater in the American art scene. LUSTER will present art together with Corvettes, motorcycles and other automotive icons that have served as inspiration for works of art. Included in the exhibit is a 1937 Cord 812 on loan from the Auburn Cord Dusenberg Automobile Museum in Auburn, IN.
- -April 25-27 is the Annual Michelin National Corvette Museum Bash. During this event Corvette fans will get to have an in-depth experience learning about the latest and greatest with the Corvette. Activities include a seminar and classroom sessions by GM certified Corvette Technician Paul Koerner. Additional seminars are presented by Michelin, Mobil 1 and GM. Also available for guests will be guided road tours, a Museum's Choice Car Show, and a live auction featuring exclusive Corvette memorabilia, and more.
- -Also coming in April will be the opening of The Vintage Shop on CorvetteStore.com. This will be another opportunity for the Museum to showcase Corvette's incredible history and the fashions that have accompanied it. Interest in vintage apparel has skyrocketed with younger generations craving a unique look. There will be a limited number of "product drops" in 2024 on the newly renovated <u>CorvetteStore.com</u>.

In other NCM news, the 2023 Corvette year-end production statistics are now available. A few of the notable stats are:

- -53,785 cars produced, 52% coupes and 48% convertibles
- -Of the 14 exterior colors offered, the most popular was Torch Red with 7,895 produced and least popular was Caffeine with 536 produced.
- -Carbon Flash was the most popular exterior stripe option and can be found on 2,363 cars
- -Right hand drive accounted for 1,312 cars produced.
- -2,504 cars were Option R8C National Corvette Museum deliveries.
