NEWS FROM THE NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM (NCM) March 2024

On February 12, 2014, at 5:38 AM the National Corvette Museum suffered a cave-in that claimed eight cars from the Museum's multi-million dollar collection. Video images captured by the Museum's security cameras went viral and all eyes were looking at the Museum's response and recovery. Beginning in June the Museum will begin celebrating 10 years since the infamous sinkhole collapse. The exhibit "Ground to Sky: The Sinkhole Reimagined" will open to the public on June 14 and run through September 15, 2024.

In honor of the tenth anniversary of the collapse, the exhibit will celebrate incredible change and growth since the event. The exhibit will document the memories, moments, and machines that made history that fateful day. Front and center of the exhibit will be the accomplishments of countless Museum staff and supporters who built back and reimagined an NCM that continues to evolve today. During those ten years there were over 15 major exhibitions, the creation of a new education gallery, tens of millions of dollars in renovations and improvements, the addition of a world-class Motorsports Park to the campus, and countless other advances. Thanks to the NCM team and supporters, the Museum has not only endured, but is thriving.

The exhibit will feature two Corvettes that were recovered from the sinkhole and fully restored, a 2009 "Blue Devil" ZR1 and the 1 millionth Corvette (a white '92 model). It also includes other cars that remain damaged from the incident and extensive multimedia that illustrate a look back at the NCM's history and a vision of the future of the Museum.

What I Did to My Corvette

Skip Sizemore — 1995 Corvette

I went out to the garage to start my 1995 Corvette that had been setting for a couple of weeks. It started right up, but was running a little rough. Other than the tachometer being a little unsteady the gauges were not showing a problem. Opening the hood, I could see the engine was shaking with a miss that was accompanied with a clicking sound. However, there a clicking sounds and then there are other clicking sounds. I was thinking it was a valve lifter going bad, but the click was not the metallic click of a lifter. Looking around the engine, I discover a spark leak at the coil wire going to the distributor at the front of the engine. The coil wire exits the Opti-spark distributor at (the type used on this vintage of C4 Corvette) the front of the engine from behind the water pump. To allow myself a little more working room I decided to remove the air intake that occupies a lot of space in this area. When the air intake was removed I discovered the rubber connection at the at the throttle body was wrinkled, cut and torn. This is what you get when you allow other people to work on your car.

So, I started trying to find a replacement part. GM no longer makes the part, so onto the computer I went to find another source. Ecklers, Corvette Central, Mid America and a few others were checked with no results. I could find performance systems (promising big power and mileage increases) but no stock replacements. However, after a reminder from Pete Rutledge, I found the part I needed on eBay. There was only one problem. I had to buy a complete used air intake system to get what I needed. It included all the parts from the air cleaner back to the throttle body. It cost \$160.00. After about a week the parts arrived and were found to be in good shape. I used the one part I needed and within an hour had everything together and the Corvette was running. Anyone need C4 parts. I have a few.
