NEWS FROM THE NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM (NCM) April 2024

I will title this "Little Known Automotive Trivia." Automobile designer Margaret "Peg" Sauer, who had previously worked for Harley Earl's "Damsels of Design," was influential in creating interiors for GM in the 1950s. In 1963 she was given an opportunity by Raymond Loewy's industrial design studio to work on his latest project, the Studebaker Avanti. The Avanti was Studebaker's new luxury performance car and Loewy's team was tasked with its design.

Loewy's studio created a design for a four-seat coupe with a very distinct appearance. The design featured an elongated hood and curved rear fenders, making the car appear like a futuristic airplane. Due to the unusual shape, the body had to be molded from fiberglass panels. The front of the car lacked a grill so the design team placed the air vents underneath the front bumper, and called it a "bottom breather." Sauer's most memorable contribution was a unique glove box equipped with a pull-out drawer. The drawer had a flip-up mirror and added storage space for small items. Unfortunately the Avanti did not save Studebaker as the company sold fewer than 6000 Avantis before closing its South Bend, Indiana plant.

However, the story does not stop there as the Avanti lived for several more decades due to a series of periodic revivals. The longest-lived of these successor cars was created by Nate and Arnold Altman, former Studebaker dealers. The Altman brothers partnered with Leo Newman, formerly overseer at Studebaker's truck parts division, to form the Avanti Motor Corporation, which, from 1965 into the 1980s, sold a modified version known as the Avanti II. Each Avanti II was custom ordered, hand-built and buyers could select from a variety of color combinations for the interior and exterior, even including shag carpet in the trunk. The Avanti II also used Chevrolet's small-block V-8 engine, the same power plant as the Corvette.

The National Corvette Museum automobile collection includes a 1977 Avanti II donated by Mike Hammer. The car has a gold interior and exterior after a Studebaker Avanti Hammer saw in his youth. It includes a Corvette engine, fiberglass body and the special glove box designed by Sauer.

In other news, the NCM Motorsports Park (MSP) has announced that they are the first track in the nation to offer E-Ray driving experiences. The two newest additions are a Rip Tide Blue E-Ray and a Sea Wolf Gray E-Ray. There are two ways one can experience these cars, (1) **Touring Laps** of four lead/follow laps on the track, or (2) a **Lightning Round** that allows you to drive four lead/follow laps on the track before riding as passenger as their professional driver takes the car on a Hot Lap.

To celebrate the E-Ray launch, the MSP team took the two new cars on a regional road trip from Detroit, MI to Nashville, TN with planned stops in Ann Arbor MI, South Bend, IND, Chicago, ILL, Indianapolis, IND, Louisville, KY, Lexington, KY, Knoxville, TN, and Pigeon Forge, TN where they took on the iconic Tail of the Dragon.

- Snack bars such as Nature Valley Granola bars





On March 12, I drove my C8 to the local Chevrolet dealer to <u>schedule</u> an oil change. "No problem," they said, "we can fit you in now, and include a factory recall, fuel injection cleaning, and throttle body service." The shuttle took me home. By 7:00pm that evening, no one had called. The <u>next afternoon</u> they finally called and picked me up. While I had been given an estimate for the service, I wasn't ready for the \$67.50 they charged me for shop supply fees. I did not give them a very high customer satisfaction score.

What I Did to My Corvette

Al McCloud, 2019 Grand Sport

This month I replaced my Michelin run flats on my 2019 Grand Sport with Continental all season Extreme Contact DWS 06 Plus XL (Front) and DWS 06 Plus SL (Rear) (50,000 mile guarantee - we'll see). Lindsay showed me that they were worn to the core. I purchased the tires on a Wednesday at Tire Rack, online, had them delivered to Discount Tires on Plank Road in Fredericksburg, and with my selected appointment time, they were installed early Friday morning in time to leave with the club for Nags Head. Total cost was just a little under \$1700. These tires are a quieter and smoother ride. Lindsay Chevrolet told me I needed new tires but they would not match the Tire Rack price and they wanted over \$2000 just for the tires. If you need new tires, the Tire Rack option is the way to go. Albert Martinez turned me on to this option and with a savings of close to \$500, I can't see why anybody would go the other way.
