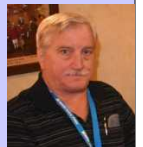

Celebrity Spotlight

--In September, 2020 the NCM unveiled what would become the first celebrity-owned car. The 1978 two-tone Corvette was special ordered by Country music singer George Jones and the one-off paint scheme of Corvette Dark Brown and Corvette Light Beige was special ordered by Jones because he liked the Pace Car look. The car was donated by Lifetime Members Lon and Anne Helton of Nashville, TN and Donna and Tim Vincent Broussard of Louisiana. Lon Helton, Past-Chair of the NCM Board of Directors and host of the radio series Country Countdown USA, was eager to support the Museum in the acquisition of the Corvette.

In 2000, Valerie C. Lee purchased the car from Jones and had him autograph the dash. It was later sold to Ronnie Collins who knew his friend Donna Vincent was a huge George Jones fan, and contacted her husband Tim when Jones decided to sell "The Possum" (the Vincent's nickname for the Corvette). The car came with Jones' front license plate which reads "Possum" and a Tennessee plate reading "NO SHOW".

--Six years ago, DeDe and George Cable were at the NCM picking up a ZR1 Stingray. Joining them were friend racecar driver and racing commentator Kyle Petty with wife Morgan and son Overton. Cable and Petty have known each other for years, first meeting when Cable was as a teenager and Petty a young boy at a hotel near Daytona International Speedway. DeDe was a babysitter for Kyle and his siblings when his father, Richard Petty, was racing the Daytona 500. Over the years the two lost contact but DeDe continued to keep in contact with his parents and racing career. Years later a customer of George, DeDe's husband, mentioned the Kyle Petty Charity Ride. George chose to participate and met Kyle along the route. George mentioned that DeDe had cared for him at a hotel in Daytona and DeDe and Kyle reconnected and since then the two families had attempted to see each other at least once a month.

In 2018, while the Cables and Pettys were in Daytona, DeDe asked numerous times for a ZR1. Nothing came of it until the couple were on a Kyle Petty Charity Ride and traveled to Mario Andretti's home and the first thing they laid eyes on was a Sebring Orange ZR1. DeDe was sold, with the only stipulation being that Kyle join her to order and pick up the Corvette. At the dealership, when ordering the car, Kyle asked: "How much horsepower does this car have?" When DeDe responded with 750 horsepower Kyle stated, "Do you know that has more horsepower than my racecar had?"

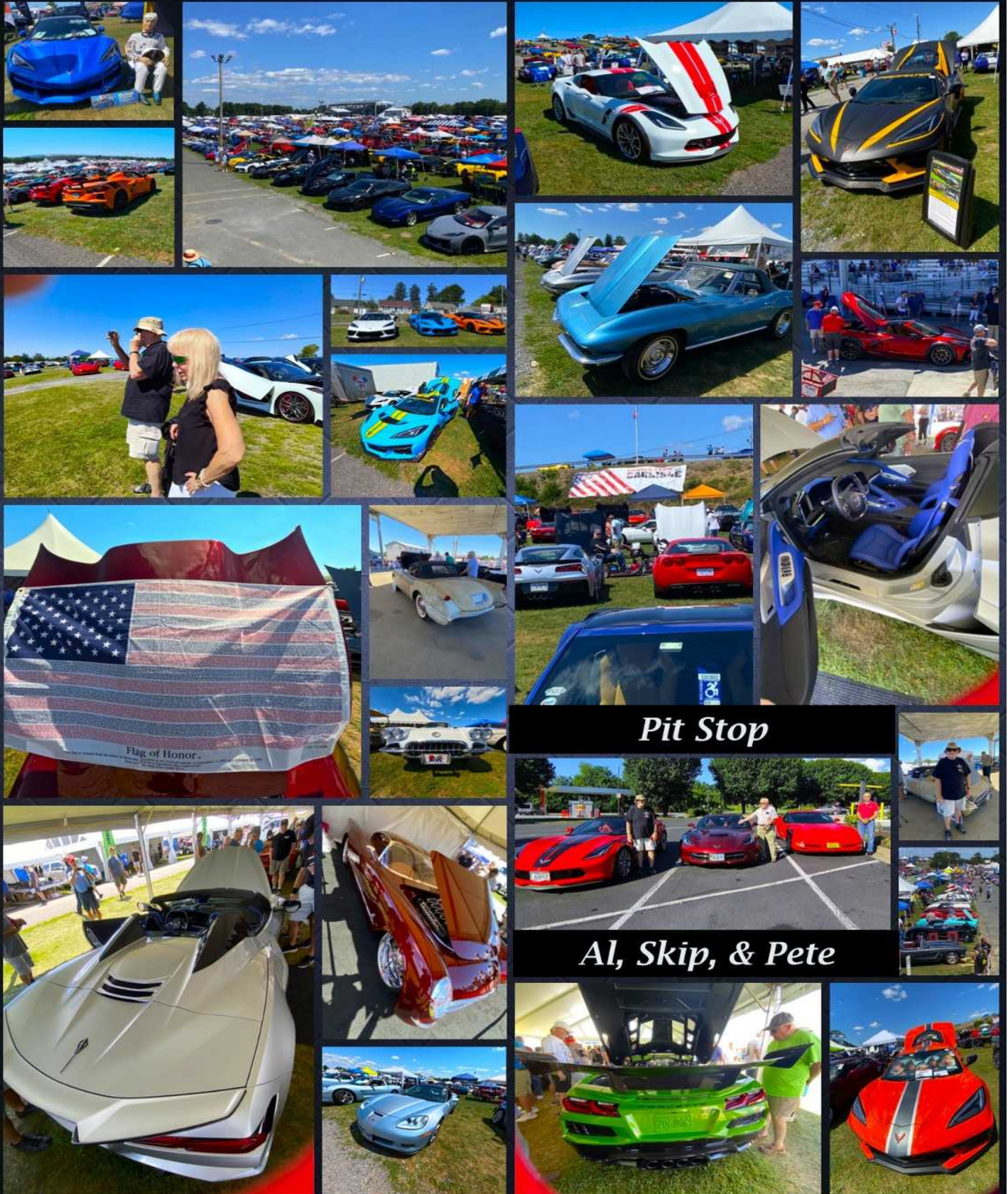

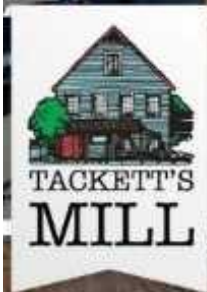

What Did You Do to Your Corvette?

Pete Rutledge — 1954 Corvette

Aside from taking the '99 Corvette to the Willing Warriors show, the main Corvette activity this month was working on a spare aftermarket Plasticon hardtop. As you may know, from 1953 to 1955, the factory did not make a hardtop for the Corvette. But two aftermarket hardtops were available for these cars, one made by Plasticon and one made by Scott. Both were made of fiberglass, but of slightly different design. The top I am working on is one I got at Carlisle a couple of years ago when I went there hoping to find a Plasticon top for my '54. Surprisingly, I was able to buy two tops for the price of one. One of the tops was pretty complete; the other lacked a rear window and the fiberglass was broken under the rear window opening. Subsequently, in a very rare event, I was able to find a rear window on eBay. So, over the last couple of months, I repaired the break and made other fiberglass repairs, removed the paint (with a razorblade), applied 2 coats of epoxy primer, and fabricated two Plasticon emblems for the sides of the top. Now I am working on installing the rear window. It turns out that the window is a little too large from top to bottom and I will have to trim about an inch of plexiglass off the entire bottom edge; then it should fit just fine. I also fabricated and gathered parts (including a find at this year's Carlisle show) for the four latches that will secure the top to the car. When done, I will be selling this top and then I'll work on the top that I will keep for my '54.

CORVETTE TECHNICIAN in Manassas

A year or two ago, information was emailed to our members about a newly hired Corvette technician at a repair shop in Manassas. Well, that tech is still working at the same shop and it may be useful to some of our members to repeat the information. The tech is Dave; he works at Clark's Automotive in Manassas. He has 36 years of auto repair experience, 15 of which were specialized on Corvettes. He is a member of Northern Virginia Corvette Club; he owns a 2003 Corvette and an early '70s Camaro.
